Types of Conjunctions	Definitions	Conjunctions
Coordinating Conjunctions	Joins words, phrases and independent clauses. Example: The park is green, but it is greener in the winter.	for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so
Subordinating Conjunctions	Introduces a dependent clause and ties it to an independent clause. Example: If you leave, I will be lonely.	after, although, as, as if, as long as, as much as, as soon as, as though, because, before, even, even if, even though, if, if only, if when, if then, inasmuch, in order that, just as, lest, now, now that, once, provided, provided that, rather than, since, so that, supposing, than, that, though, unless, until, when, whenever, where, whereas, where if, wherever, whether, which, while, who, whoever, why
